

Consider This: As you answer the review questions, pause to look at the images, and respond to the journal prompts in each chapter, please consider the women who will read this devotional—women a lot like you.

Questions:

Are the questions thought-provoking...and do they go further to lead you to ask the Holy Spirit for help?

Which question(s) triggered a response in you that led to worship or deeper intimacy?

Could a question be worded better? Was there something off-putting or confusing?

Journal Prompts:

Are the journal prompts worth your time? Should they go deeper?

Which journal prompt drew you to worship?

Which ones made you think differently about God? About yourself?

Which ones prompted you to think about the past in a new way? About the future in a new way?

Scripture:

Which scriptures stood out to you as particularly personal or valuable?

Which scriptures prompted worship?

Which ones made you think differently about God? About yourself?

Immersive Items:

Did any of the photos, songs, or poetry particularly stand out to you?

Did any of them prompt you to worship?

Did anything occur to you that *should* have been included but *wasn't*?

Practicology:

In each chapter, we hope readers LOOK UP, LOOK DOWN, and LOOK AROUND. We look up to see God's character and what he is saying or doing. We look down and see how that changes us. Then we look around to see where we can participate in what God is doing. This is theology in practice.
